Cluster / Inflorescence Bloom Color: Green Fruit: Less than 1 cm broad Seed: Nearly globose, ca. 2.5 mm in diam. Fl. almost throughout year. Trunk (Bole): Woody stem Habitat: An understorey plant in forests and thickets Habit: Evergreen Shrub
