Description	Growth Rate: Fast Maintenance: Low Leaves: bright pink to the deepest burgundy, green and cream; 30–60 cm(12–24 in) (rarely 75 cm or 30 in) long and 5–10-centimetre (2.0–3.9 in) wide at thetop of a woody stem; are spirally arranged into a fanlike shape at the stem tips; when maturing plants lose their lower leaves Flowers: 40–60-centimetre (16–24 in) long panicles of small scented flowers; Bloom Color: yellowish to red Bloom Time: Mid Summer Fruit: Round red berry about 8 mm diameter. Fruiting Time: Late Summer Trunk (bole): Shrub or small tree which can be unbranched or freely-branched Habitat: Often abundant in various types of forest (dry, dense, edges), on forested ridges, in thickets, and sometimes near beaches Habit: Evergreen Shrub
